## ETHEL RUBY GOOD 1890-1948

ETHEL was born 29<sup>th</sup> SEPT 1890 the youngest of four children to WILLIAM BOYETT GOOD AND SUSAN GOOD,
At 5 Fredrick Street Landport.
She was christened 19<sup>th</sup> MAY 1891 at ALL SAINTS CHURCH



WILLIAM was a Rounds person/Butcher and the household in Oct 1891 comprised WILLIAM BOYETT GOOD, SUSAN GOOD (NEE OLFORD), SUSAN FLORENCE GOOD (5yrs), AGNES MINNIE GOOD (4yrs), WILLIAM BOYETT GOOD (1YR), and ETHEL RUBY GOOD (5MTHS) and EDITH ALBRIGHT (17yrs) domestic servant.



Susan Florence Good married William Edward Blanchard in Portsmouth in 1901 William Boyett Good (jnr) born 8<sup>th</sup> May 1889, died 3rd September 1921

Soon after WILLIAM died at the early age of 46, SUSAN and the children moved to 80 Clarence Street Landport, which was just one road away from Frederick Street

(4 generations of the Good family had lived in Clarence Street)

ETHEL continued to live there with her husband and mother



following her wedding in 1911.

ETHEL married ROBERT on 10<sup>th</sup> Sept 1911at ST MARY'S CHURCH, and soon after ROBERT WILLIAM HENRY was born 24<sup>th</sup> April 1912, with JAMES FREDERICK (FRED) being born in 1918.



ETHEL moved to 16 Nelson Road Landport sometime after the death of her husband in 1945. She is mentioned in the 1946-47 Register of Electors as living at No 16, with FRED and DOT her son and daughter in law, who moved to Malins Road either at the time she went into hospital, or shortly afterwards. The register of electors for 1948 has her living with her son BOB, across the road at number 13, but none of us Grandchildren can remember this, so it may have been for election and address purposes only. Since her house, was only rented, it was probably given up on her entry into hospital.

ETHEL died from Tuberculosis, on the 8<sup>th</sup> Nov 1948 aged 58, in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, and was buried alongside ROBERT at Kingston Cemetery Portsmouth.
