GEORGE HENRY GOOD(1852-1929)

George Henry Good was born on 12 July 1852 at 7 Commons Street, Portsea and was the son of Jonathan Charles Good who was working as a blacksmith in the dockyard and his wife Sarah. Sarah's maiden name was Earwicker.

On the 1861 Census the family were to be found at 32 Clarence Street and consisted of Jonathan Charles and Sarah and their children Jonathan Charles, George Henry, Sarah Elizabeth, Harriet Knight and William Boyett.

On the 1881 Census Jonathan Charles and Sarah were living at 15 Clarence Street with their youngest son Henry Shadrach. Meanwhile George Henry and Mary Ann were living at 26 St Cuthbert Road, Portsea.

On 12 December 1880 George Henry married Mary Ann Hunt at the Register office in Portsea Island. George Henry was living at 17 Clarence Street and was a boilermaker. Mary Ann was living at 11 Meadow Street.

George Henry went to work in Simon's Town Dockyard, South Africa sometime in the 1880s for a period of about twenty years. George Henry and Mary Ann had six, possibly seven children. As most of their children were probably born when they were out in South Africa exact dates of birth are not known for most of them. The children were:

It seems probable that the period in South Africa may have been from 1885-1905. There is no sign of the family on the 1901 Census. However George Henry Junior married Violet Edith Georgina Morton at St Mark's Church, Portsmouth on 4 December 1906. It seems also likely that Mary Ann died during the family's time in South Africa for in 1907 George Henry remarried and was a widower. No death certificate can be found in England for Mary Ann.

George Henry married Annie Louise Lambert, a widow on 28 September 1907 at St Luke's Church, Portsea. He was a boilermaker and was living at 228 Somers Road at the time. Annie died in 1910 and was buried in Kingston Cemetery on 9 April 1910.

George Henry married for a third time on 7 October 1911 at the United Methodist Church Brougham Road, Southsea. His bride was Louisa Evans a widow. At the time George Henry was living at 17 Elm Road and was still working as a boilermaker.

Around 1912 George Henry became the publican of the Anerley Arms Pub. It was a Lon's House on the corner of Canal Walk, Portsmouth. This pub was demolished in 1970.

George Henry died on 26 February 1929 at 51 Mayles Road.
